Board members had to make tough decisions.


Could organisations continue as the country locked down? Could workplaces be adapted for staff, volunteers, and service users?

We find ourselves still in transitional times, becoming familiar with a 'hybrid' and 'blended' ways of working, but we are finding ways to meet face to face again and there may be opportunities for trustees to return to non-virtual board meetings.

So perhaps this is a good time for your board to re-evaluate priorities, re-open buildings, re-start events, re-board trustees and re-view your governing documents and constitutions?

Reviewing your governing document regularly is extremely important, ensuring your organisation works as effectively as it can in the short, medium and long terms.

Why not use the following questions at your next board meeting to do a governing document check-up and prompt some discussion?





Is your Governing document up to date?



Are you working within it?



Do any areas need updating for your organisation to thrive?



Is your membership information and data protection up to date?



Can you hold virtual board meetings/general meetings and is this written into the document?



What is the trustee length of appointment and does this need to be amended or new trustees recruited?



Are there areas of training VAO could help with?
